Representative **OSHER**: Thank you, Madam Speaker. Madam Speaker, Fellow Members of the House, it is my distinct pleasure to rise today to recognize Ruth White.

Ruth is an Orono High School student and an outstanding scholar-athlete. She's a member of the National Honor Society and she's won awards at the Maine State Science Fair and she's an incredible runner. Ruth placed 17th in the country in the 2022 Champ Sports National Cross Country Championships. She was recently named the Gatorade Maine Girl's Cross Country Runner of the Year, Portland Press Herald Maine State Girls Cross Country Runner of the Year and the Varsity Maine Girls Cross Country Runner of the Year. In addition, she's the only runner in Maine history to win the New England Cross Country Championship two years in a row. Our community is so very proud of her.

When I was a child, girls did not have many opportunities to participate in athletics. My brothers played ice hockey and

soccer on club and school teams, and I wanted to play ice hockey, too, but girls were not welcome unless they were the very best of the best. When I was 12, Title IX was signed into law. Title IX is the portion of the Educational Amendments Act that recognized gender equity in education as a civil right. As schools began to comply with that law, the opportunities for girls to participate in school sports increased. By the time I went to college at Cornell University, Title IX was in effect there. I, a figure skater, was invited to join the women's ice hockey team. My ability to skate was an asset to the team because there weren't enough young women who had played ice hockey before college to fill the team's roster.

Now, 50 years after Title IX, girls in Maine and around the U.S. have opportunity to participate in athletics from an early age. Ruth and so many other girls are now able to participate and excel in sports, gain the benefit of being part of an athletic team, be supported by their schools, and achieve incredible successes.

Ruth is not here with us today because, in addition to her dedication to athletics, she's dedicated to her studies and didn't want to miss class. I look forward to delivering her sentiment to her in Orono.
