**Sec. 1. 39-A MRSA §328-B, sub-§1, ¶A,** as enacted by PL 2009, c. 408, §1, is amended to read:

A. "Cancer" means kidney cancer, non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, colon cancer, leukemia, brain cancer, bladder cancer, multiple myeloma, prostate cancer, testicular cancer or breast cancer or gynecologic cancer.

7 SUMMARY

 Under the Maine Workers' Compensation Act of 1992, there is a rebuttable presumption that a firefighter who has contracted kidney cancer, non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, colon cancer, leukemia, brain cancer, bladder cancer, multiple myeloma, prostate cancer, testicular cancer or breast cancer has contracted the cancer as a result of that firefighter's employment. This bill adds gynecologic cancer to the definition of "cancer" so that there is also a rebuttable presumption under that Act for a firefighter who contracts gynecologic cancer.
