1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 26 MRSA §664, sub-§1-A is enacted to read:
3 4	1-A. Youth wage. Notwithstanding subsection 1, an employer may pay a person who is:
5 6	A. Sixteen or 17 years of age \$1.00 per hour less than the minimum hourly wage established in subsection 1;
7 8	B. Fifteen years of age \$2.00 per hour less than the minimum hourly wage established in subsection 1; and
9 10	C. Fourteen years of age or under \$3.00 per hour less than the minimum hourly wage established in subsection 1.
11	SUMMARY
12 13 14 15 16	This bill establishes a minimum hourly wage for persons who are 16 or 17 years of age that is \$1.00 per hour less than the regular minimum hourly wage, a minimum hourly wage for persons who are 15 years of age that is \$2.00 per hour less than the regular minimum hourly wage and a minimum hourly wage for persons who are 14 years of age and under that is \$3.00 per hour less than the regular minimum hourly wage.
