14	Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting the following:
15 16 17	'Resolve, Establishing the Commission to Study Improvements to Conventiona Infrastructure and Storm Water Management at the Former Brunswick Naval Air Station'
18	Amend the bill by striking out everything after the title and inserting the following:
19 20	'Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do no become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
21 22 23 24	Whereas, evaluating the need to replace, repair or upgrade conventional infrastructure and storm water management throughout the entirety of the former Brunswick Naval Air Station is of critical importance to the health, safety and prosperity of the State and the southern midcoast region; and
25 26 27 28	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now therefore,
29 30 31 32	Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That, notwithstanding Joint Rule 353 the Commission to Study Improvements to Conventional Infrastructure and Storm Water Management at the Former Brunswick Naval Air Station, referred to in this resolve as "the commission," is established.
33 34	Sec. 2. Membership. Resolved: That the commission consists of 9 members as follows:

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- 1. Two members of the Senate appointed by the President of the Senate, including a member from each of the 2 parties holding the largest number of seats in the Legislature, with preference given to members who cosponsored Legislative Document 941 in the 131st Legislature;
- 2. Two members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House, including a member from each of the 2 parties holding the largest number of seats in the Legislature, with preference given to members who sponsored or cosponsored Legislative Document 941 in the 131st Legislature;
- 3. One member representing the Office of the Town Manager in the Town of Brunswick, appointed by the President of the Senate;
- 4. One member representing an organization composed of Brunswick-area residents that advocate for a safe environment, appointed by the Speaker of the House;
 - 5. The Commissioner of Environmental Protection, or the commissioner's designee;
- 6. The Commissioner of Economic and Community Development, or the commissioner's designee; and
- 7. The executive director of the Midcoast Regional Redevelopment Authority, or the executive director's designee.
- **Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved:** That the first-named Senate member is the Senate chair and the first-named House of Representatives member is the house chair of the commission.
- **Sec. 4. Appointments. Resolved:** That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council once all appointments have been completed. After appointment of all members, the chairs shall call and convene the first meeting of the commission. If 30 days or more after the effective date of this resolve a majority of but not all appointments have been made, the chairs may request authority and the Legislative Council may grant authority for the commission to meet and conduct its business.

Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the commission has the following duties:

- 1. Evaluate the need to replace, repair or upgrade conventional infrastructure and storm water management throughout the former Brunswick Naval Air Station for the purpose of protecting the health and safety of residents, businesses, nonprofit organizations and the former naval air station's flora and fauna;
- 2. Review ongoing federal and state remediation and safe storage efforts with respect to perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances, perfluorooctanesulfonic acid and perfluorooctanoic acid, also known as PFAS, PFOS and PFOA, respectively, and other known hazardous chemicals in order to ensure that any steps to replace, repair or upgrade the infrastructure identified in subsection 1 are consistent with such efforts;
- 3. Recommend appropriate steps to replace, repair or upgrade conventional infrastructure and storm water management throughout the former Brunswick Naval Air Station. In developing recommendations under this subsection, the commission shall consider the following:

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1 2	A. Any state policy changes that may be necessary to enable infrastructure upgrades at the former Brunswick Naval Air Station;
3 4	B. The potential division of responsibilities between state and federal entities to complete such work and the costs associated with that work; and
5 6	C. Any potential for federal funding or grant assistance that may be available to help fund the work.
7 8	The commission shall consult with each member of Maine's congressional delegation for input and assistance in conducting each of its duties under this section.
9 10 11	As used in this section, "conventional infrastructure" includes roads and sidewalks, underground facilities as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 23, section 3360-A, subsection 1, paragraph E and utilities as defined in Title 35-A, section 102, subsection 13.
12 13 14	Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the Legislative Council shall provide necessary staffing services to the commission, except that Legislative Council staff support is not authorized when the Legislature is in regular or special session.
15 16	Sec. 7. Meetings. Resolved: That the commission is authorized to hold a maximum of 4 meetings.
17 18 19 20 21 22	Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That, notwithstanding Joint Rule 353, no later than January 1, 2024, the commission shall submit a report that includes its findings and recommendations for presentation to the Joint Standing Committee on Innovation, Development, Economic Advancement and Business. The Joint Standing Committee on Innovation, Development, Economic Advancement and Business is authorized to submit legislation related to the report to the Second Regular Session of the 131st Legislature.
23 24	Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this legislation takes effect when approved.'
25 26	Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.
27	SUMMARY
28 29 30	This amendment establishes the Commission to Study Improvements to Conventional Infrastructure and Storm Water Management at the Former Brunswick Naval Air Station, which is a 9-member commission directed to:
31 32 33 34	1. Evaluate the need to replace, repair or upgrade conventional infrastructure and storm water management throughout the entirety of the former Brunswick Naval Air Station for the purpose of protecting the health and safety of residents, businesses, nonprofit organizations and the former naval air station's flora and fauna;

2. Review ongoing federal and state remediation and safe storage efforts with respect

to perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances, perfluorooctanesulfonic acid and perfluorooctanoic acid, also known as PFAS, PFOS and PFOA, respectively, and other

known hazardous chemicals in order to ensure that any steps to replace, repair or upgrade

infrastructure are consistent with such efforts; and

l	3. Recommend appropriate steps for the replacement, repair of upgrade of conventional

4	The commission is required to submit a report no later than January 1, 2024 for
