Sec. 1. 15 MRSA §5821, 3rd ¶, as enacted by PL 2021, c. 454, §5, is amended to read:

4 Unless seized property under this section includes United States currency in excess of 5 \$\frac{\$100,000 \subset{15,000}}{15,000}\$, a law enforcement agency, prosecuting authority, state agency, county 6 or municipality may not enter into an agreement to transfer or refer property seized under 7 this section to a federal agency directly, indirectly, through adoption, through an 8 intergovernmental joint task force or by other means that circumvent the provisions of this 9 section.

10	SUMMARY
11	This bill decreases from \$100,000 to \$15,000 the amount of seized currency over which
12	a state governmental agency, county or municipality may enter into an agreement to

13 transfer or refer to a federal agency seized property of an owner convicted of a crime.
