Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. Temporary waiver of educator performance evaluations. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, a school administrative unit is not required to evaluate an educator as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, section 13701, subsection 1 pursuant to a performance evaluation and professional growth system developed in accordance with Title 20-A, chapter 508 until the 2022-2023 school year.

8 SUMMARY

This bill temporarily waives, until the 2022-2023 school year, the requirement that school administrative units evaluate the performance of teachers and principals.
