## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

## Sec. 1. 10 MRSA §9724, sub-§8 is enacted to read:

8. Model residential mechanical ventilation systems codes. Notwithstanding any provision of this chapter to the contrary, a municipality may not adopt a standard or code governing the design and installation of residential mechanical ventilation systems, beyond what may be specified in the Maine Uniform Building and Energy Code, other than the Canadian Standards Association Standard for Residential Mechanical Ventilation Systems F326-M91. This subsection does not require a municipality to adopt a standard or code governing the design and installation of residential mechanical ventilation systems beyond what is specified in the Maine Uniform Building and Energy Code. A standard or code governing the design and installation of residential mechanical ventilation systems adopted by a municipality prior to the effective date of this subsection is not invalidated by this subsection, but if the municipality replaces that standard or code it must adopt the Canadian Standards Association Standard for Residential Mechanical Ventilation Systems F326-M91.

16 SUMMARY

This bill prohibits a municipality from adopting standards for the design and installation of residential mechanical ventilation systems, beyond what may be specified in the Maine Uniform Building and Energy Code, other than the Canadian Standards Association's Standard for Residential Mechanical Ventilation Systems F326-M91. A municipality is not required to adopt standards for residential mechanical ventilation systems but if it does, it must adopt the Canadian Standards Association standard. The bill also provides that a standard or code governing the design and installation of residential mechanical ventilation systems adopted by a municipality prior to the effective date of this provision is not invalidated, but if the municipality replaces that standard or code it must adopt the CSA Standard for Residential Mechanical Ventilation Systems F326-M91.
