It requires the authority to report, by January 1, 2022, on the success of the pilot programs and include in the report recommendations for 22 a permanent, statewide program and the cost of such a program. It allows the committee 23 24 of jurisdiction to report out a bill based on the report to the Second Regular Session of the 25 130th Legislature.
