1 §6575-J. Seizure of illegal elvers

In addition to any other penalty imposed, elvers that are <u>taken</u>, <u>sold</u>, purchased or possessed that were taken in violation of any law or rule pertaining to elvers are subject to seizure by any officer authorized to enforce this Part. The entire bulk pile containing <u>illegally harvested illegal</u> elvers may be seized. For the purposes of this section, "bulk pile" means all elvers in the possession of a holder of an elver fishing license, an elver <u>dealer's license or an elver exporter's license person</u> who fished for, took, possesses or bought elvers in violation of any law or rule regulating elvers under this Part.

5. Fees. The fee for an elver exporter's license is \$5,000. If the department requires
inspection of elvers prior to export, the department may charge up to \$500 for each
inspection.

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SUMMARY

This bill clarifies the laws governing the use of the elver transaction card system and the seizure of illegal elvers. It makes it explicit that any currency used in violation of a marine resources law may be taken through the libel process. It requires license revocation for an individual who sells or purchases elvers without using the transaction card system. Finally, it establishes that if the Department of Marine Resources requires inspection of elver shipments prior to export, the department may charge a fee of up to \$500 per inspection.
