15 16	' <b>Emergency preamble. Whereas,</b> acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
17 18 19 20 21 22 23 24	Whereas, this resolve creates the Commission to Study Fair, Equitable and Competitive Income Tax Policy for Maine's Families and Small Businesses and directs the commission to study and report to the Legislature on issues associated with the effects of income tax policy on the State's working families and small businesses and develop recommendations designed to ensure that the tax policy of the State: is fair and equitable, improves the competitive position of the State, encourages more investment in new and existing small businesses in the State and helps attract skilled and knowledgeable workers necessary for a sustainable, growing economy in all regions of the State; and
25 26	Whereas, the commission is directed to report the results of its work to the Legislature by December 6, 2023; and
27 28 29	<b>Whereas,</b> the work of the commission will be too complicated and demanding to be accomplished in the period of time between 90 days after the adjournment of the First Special Session and December 6, 2023; and
30 31	Whereas, additional time is needed for the commission to provide a detailed and complete report to the Legislature by December 6, 2023; and
32 33	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as

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- immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now,
   therefore, be it
   Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission to Study Fair,
- Equitable and Competitive Income Tax Policy for Maine's Families and Small Businesses,
   referred to in this resolve as "the commission," is established.
- 6 Sec. 2. Membership. Resolved: That, notwithstanding Joint Rule 353, the 7 commission consists of 16 members appointed as follows:
- 8 1. Three members of the Senate appointed by the President of the Senate, including a
  9 member from each of the 2 parties holding the largest number of seats in the Legislature;
- Three members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the
   House, including a member from each of the 2 parties holding the largest number of seats
   in the Legislature;
  - 3. Six members appointed by the Governor as follows:
- 14 A. One member representing the Office of the Governor;
- B. One member representing a statewide organization that represents business
   interests;
- C. One member representing a statewide organization that represents Maine heritage
   industry interests;
- 19 D. One member who is a tax policy expert;

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- 20 E. One member who is an expert in tax accounting; and
- 21 F. One member representing a nonprofit organization with expertise in taxation;
- 4. One public member representing the interests of small businesses and one public
   member representing the interests of working families, appointed by the President of the
   Senate; and
- 5. One public member representing the interests of small businesses and one public
   member representing the interests of working families, appointed by the Speaker of the
   House.
- 28 Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved: That the first-named Senate member is the Senate chair 29 and the first-named House of Representatives member is the House chair of the 30 commission.
- Sec. 4. 31 Appointments; convening of commission. Resolved: That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this 32 resolve. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative 33 34 Council once all appointments have been completed. After appointment of all members, 35 the chairs shall call and convene the first meeting of the commission. If 30 days or more after the effective date of this resolve a majority of but not all appointments have been 36 37 made, the chairs may request authority and the Legislative Council may grant authority for the commission to meet and conduct its business. 38
- 39 Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall study issues associated with 40 the effects of income tax policy on the State's working families and small businesses and 41 shall develop recommendations designed to ensure that the tax policy of the State: is fair

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and equitable, improves the competitive position of the State, encourages more investment 1 in new and existing small businesses in the State and helps attract skilled and 2 knowledgeable workers necessary for a sustainable, growing economy in all regions of the 3 State. In examining the issues, the commission shall consider measures designed to level 4 the playing field for small businesses and to aid entrepreneurs, shall consider the 5 importance to working families and businesses of adequately funding important 6 government services, such as aid to local services, education, infrastructure maintenance 7 and affordable health care, and shall propose measures that ensure these services are 8 adequately funded. The commission shall also evaluate the direct impact of any proposed 9 tax changes on after-tax income by income decile. 10

Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the Legislative Council shall provide
 necessary staffing services to the commission, except that Legislative Council staff support
 is not authorized when the Legislature is in regular or special session.

14 **Sec. 7. Provision of information to commission. Resolved:** That the 15 Department of Administrative and Financial Services, Maine Revenue Services shall 16 provide to the commission information, consistent with the restrictions set forth in the 17 Maine Revised Statutes, Title 36, section 191, that is requested by the commission.

Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That, no later than December 6, 2023, the commission
 shall submit a report that includes its findings and recommendations, including suggested
 legislation, for presentation to the Second Regular Session of the 131st Legislature.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this legislation
 takes effect when approved.'

Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section
 number to read consecutively.

SUMMARY

26 This amendment replaces the bill with a resolve that creates the Commission to Study 27 Fair, Equitable and Competitive Income Tax Policy for Maine's Families and Small Businesses and directs it to study and report to the Legislature on issues associated with the 28 29 effects of income tax policy on the State's working families and small businesses and 30 develop recommendations designed to ensure that the tax policy of the State: is fair and equitable, improves the competitive position of the State, encourages more investment in 31 new and existing small businesses in the State and helps attract skilled and knowledgeable 32 workers necessary for a sustainable, growing economy in all regions of the State. The 33 34 amendment also adds an emergency preamble and an emergency clause.
