1 **Emergency preamble.** Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not 2 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and 3 Whereas, the current laws governing arrearage management programs are repealed 4 September 30, 2024; and 5 Whereas, this legislation proposes to indefinitely continue transmission and distribution utilities' arrearage management programs for low-income residential 6 customers; and 8 Whereas, to prevent the repeal of current laws governing arrearage management programs, this legislation must take effect immediately; and 9 10 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within 11 the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, 12 13 therefore, 14 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 15 Sec. 1. 35-A MRSA §3214, sub-§2-A, as amended by PL 2021, c. 101, §1, is further amended by repealing the last blocked paragraph. 16 17 Sec. 2. 35-A MRSA §10110, sub-§2, ¶L, as amended by PL 2021, c. 101, §2, is further amended by repealing the first blocked paragraph. 18 19 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this legislation takes effect when approved. 20 21 **SUMMARY** 22 This bill makes permanent the provisions of law governing arrearage management 23 programs implemented by transmission and distribution utilities to assist eligible low-24 income residential customers who are in arrears on their electricity bills by eliminating the 25 future repeal of these provisions.
