An Act to Ensure That Restrooms Are Available for Use During Business Hours at Certain Drive-through Restaurants

1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §1685, sub-§2 is enacted to read:
3 4 5	2. Drive-through restaurant. "Drive-through restaurant" means a restaurant that has facilities for customers to consume food inside the building where the food is prepared, but that is open only for drive-through food service.
6 7	Sec. 2. 22 MRSA §1686, first ¶, as amended by PL 2013, c. 264, §2, is further amended to read:
8 9 10 11 12 13 14 15	An eating establishment <u>or drive-through restaurant</u> must provide at least one toilet facility for the use of its customers. Toilet facilities that require access through the food preparation area or the use of which would in any way cause the establishment to be in violation of any state law or rule may not be considered as fulfilling this requirement. The location of the toilets must be clearly marked, and the toilets must be maintained in a sanitary condition and in good repair and their location must be identifiable from the eating area. There may not be a charge for their use. Lavatory facilities must be located within or immediately adjacent to all toilet rooms or vestibules.
16	Sec. 3. 22 MRSA §1688, 2nd ¶ is enacted to read:
17 18	When renewing a license pursuant to chapter 562, the department shall consider whether a drive-through restaurant was in compliance with section 1686.

20 21 22	This bill requires restaurants that have facilities for customers to consume food inside the building where the food is prepared, but that are open only for drive-through food service, to provide at least one toilet facility for the use of its customers.
