Resolve, to Sufficiently Staff Overnight Behavioral Health Crisis Facilities

- Sec. 1. Department of Health and Human Services to establish overnight behavioral health crisis facility staffing levels. Resolved: That the Department of Health and Human Services shall adopt rules requiring a facility providing overnight behavioral health crisis services under rule Chapter 101: MaineCare Benefits Manual, Chapter II, Section 65, Behavioral Health Services, to establish staffing ratios based on a clinical assessment of the acuity of the residential milieu and not fewer than:
 - 1. One staff person to every 3 clients between the hours of 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.; and
 - 2. One staff person to every 4 clients between the hours of 7 p.m. to 7 a.m.

Rules adopted pursuant to this section are routine technical rules as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.

11 SUMMARY

This bill requires the Department of Health and Human Services to adopt rules requiring a facility providing overnight behavioral health crisis services to establish staffing ratios based on a clinical assessment of the acuity of the residential milieu and not fewer than one staff person to every 3 clients between the hours of 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. and one staff person to every 4 clients between the hours of 7 p.m. to 7 a.m.
