Anyone harvesting, possessing, shipping, or transporting or selling seaweed that 28 has detached naturally and is dead. 29 **SUMMARY** 30 This bill makes technical changes to the State's marine resources laws. It eliminates 31 the Aquaculture Monitoring, Research and Development Fund, which is no longer 32 capitalized. It clarifies language regarding the requirement for a license holder to have the license holder's license, elver transaction card and photo identification in the license 33 34 holder's possession when engaging in licensed activities. It also removes an existing 35 exception to holding a seaweed permit when selling seaweed that has detached naturally 36 and is dead.
