4 5	E. Seven agency liquor stores in a municipality with a population over $\frac{15,000}{10,000}$ but less than 20,001;
6 7	Sec. 2. 28-A MRSA §453, sub-§1-A, ¶F, as enacted by PL 2019, c. 74, §1, is repealed.
8 9	Sec. 3. 28-A MRSA §453, sub-§1-A, as amended by PL 2021, c. 172, §1, is further amended by amending the first blocked paragraph to read:
10 11 12 13 14	The bureau may issue one additional agency liquor store license beyond those otherwise authorized by this subsection in a municipality with a population of less than 10,000 15,000. The bureau may consider the impact of seasonal population or tourism and other related information provided by the municipality requesting an additional agency liquor store license.

16 17 18 19	This bill increases from 6 to 7 the number of agency liquor stores the Department of Administrative and Financial Services, Bureau of Alcoholic Beverages and Lottery Operations may license in a municipality with a population over 10,000 but less than 15,001.
20 21 22 23 24	Current law authorizes the bureau to issue one additional agency liquor store license in a municipality with a population of less than 10,000, considering the impact of seasonal population or tourism and other related information. The bill allows the bureau to issue one additional agency liquor store license in a municipality with a population of less than 15,000.
