1. Federal Overview – Susan Howard, American Association of State Highway Transportation Officials

FAST Act - Fiscal year 2016-2020

- \$305 billion in total funding; \$281 billion guaranteed from the Highway Trust Fund
- About 93 percent of highway dollars are apportioned to States
- Includes multimodal funding
- \$7.6 billion of unobligated contract authority rescinds on July 1, 2020

Since 2008 the Highway Trust Fund has been Sustained by General Fund Transfers

- Taxes coming in are not covering costs

Congressional Budget Office projects a \$200 billion short fall over the next 10 years

- Impacts expected to hit in 2021
- Cause: gas tax has not been raised since 1993, has not kept up with inflation
- Vehicle miles traveled has remained relatively steady
- Electric vehicles make up 1-2% of the total fleet

National Level Policy Propositions

- Increase Motor Fuel Tax
- Per Barrel Oil Tax
- Freight Based User Fee
- Road Usage Charge (Vehicle Miles Traveled)
 - -- discussed options used or considered in other states

State Financing

- General Obligation Bonds
- GARVEE Bonds
- Private Activity
- TIFIA Federal Credit Assistance
- Public/Private Partnerships

- 54 Funding Sources
- 2000 2015 Comparison

Five Main Funding Trends

- Gas Tax
 - -- 22 states index their gas tax
 - -- 8.3 years since Maine increased gas tax
 - -- Indexing repealed in 2012
 - -- 2019 Legislation Overview
 - -- States such as Virginia and Georgia apply tax to specific roads
- Vehicle Registration Fees
 - -- Tiered Registration (Oregon, HB 2017)
 - -- Separate Fee on Vehicle Value (California, SB 1)
- Alternative Fuel Vehicle Fees
 - -- 26 States, some indexed, some biennial
- Road Usage Charge
 - -- State & Federal Programs
 - -- Shared Mobility (Minnesota)
 - -- I-95 Pilot
 - -- Collection costs result in RUC not being as efficient as gas tax
- Tolling
 - -- Non-Federal Aid Roads
 - -- Federal law allows certain exceptions
 - -- See slides re: Florida, New York, Washington, and Wyoming
