




– PRE-K ACCESS

Maine has made large strides in making public pre-K available to 4-year-olds over the past several years. Policymakers at the state and local levels can further expand access for Maine children by addressing high financial costs for opening or expanding existing programs, securing adequate facilities, and supporting schools in recruiting and retaining pre-K teachers and staff.

WHERE WE STARTED (2013)




WHERE WE STAND (2019)




- State adoption of 60% by 2025 goal
- Annual reporting to both the IDEA Committee and Education and Cultural Affairs Committee
- Coordination with State Workforce Board and MaineSpark

A few of the MaineSpark Successes

- Established a high-functioning management framework that is rooted in a collective impact approach to build on existing efforts, provide mutual support among stakeholders, and align organizations on a shared goal
- Attracted national and state funders to support education and workforce development
- UMS led the way to launch the “All Learning Counts” project focused on credential pathways bringing \$350,000 grant funds to Maine
- Increased supports for adult learners through additional scholarships and a network of navigators to support adults interested in postsecondary education
- Expanded tracking of credentials in career and technical education centers and regions
- Maine’s efforts were constantly highlighted nationally

Maine's Progress

To reach state goals, the state will not only have to maintain current rates of attainment but also significantly increase the number of people who enroll in programs and earn all types of credentials beyond high school. With the inclusion of workforce certificates (beginning in 2014) and certifications (in 2018), **Maine's overall rate of educational attainment has increased by 13.7 percentage points since 2008.**

- Supported the development of the 10-year economic strategy
- Participated in the Economic Recovery Committee process
