Part I – Does it make sense to consider an OPEGA review of the topic at this time?

1.	Is the topic outside of the GOC's mission and OPEGA's statutory authority?				
2.	Is the subject matter already addressed by an OPEGA review planned, or in progress, or covered by a topic already on the stand-by list?				
3.	Has the issue(s) been satisfactorily covered by a recent audit, investigation or review by any other administrative body, judicial entity, or legislative study committee such that the GOC is satisfied the issue warrants no further study? Is there such an effort currently in progress that addresses the issue(s)?

These four points represent guidelines for the Government Oversight Committee to weigh as they consider whether it makes sense to consider the topic for an OPEGA review at this time. If the answer to all of the above questions is "No," the topic is suitable for further consideration. However, the GOC reserves the right to act on each request individually as the Committee deems appropriate.

After considering the number of criteria met by the topic (i.e. points assigned above), the GOC				

may compare this topic to other topics already on the Stand-by list or Plan for Reviews and Projects by OPEGA. The Committee will then decide what action to take on the topic. Options include:

- a. No further action at this time
- b. Refer to another entity
- c. Authorize OPEGA to conduct limited research and respond to requestor
- d. Place topic on Stand-by list
- e. Place topic on Plan for Program Reviews and Projects by OPEGA
- f. Initiate Rapid Response Review

Note: In selecting topics the GOC may want to consider keeping the Stand-by list to a manageable size and working to ensure the list is not limited to topics associated with only one department.
