
RESOURCE: Education Indicators

- Additional resources and information about Maine schools and students


RESOURCE: Education Funding in Maine

- MaineSpark's member organizations share a common goal: by 2025, 60% of Mainers will hold education and workforce credentials that position Maine and its families for success.






2017 - LD 1638 "An Act to Promote Workforce Education Attainment"
