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Capital Campaign

- MMA launched a \$20 million scholarship campaign in March 2020. The campaign goals were reached by December 2021
- Since 2015, 48 new endowed scholarships with a minimum gift of \$25,000 have been established

- MMA endowed scholarship funds doubled from \$20 million to \$41 million
- The annual allocation of endowed scholarship increased from \$750,000 in FY218 to \$1.2 million this year

Strategic Enrollment Management

- MMA engaged the services of Ruffalo Noel Levitz, an enrollment management company, to assess recruitment, retention and financial aid strategies.
- A new Vice President for Enrollment Management and Marketing was hired in 2021.
- A financial aid consultant was engaged in 2021 to review and update financial aid policies and procedures.

Center for Professional Mariner Development

- MMA opened the Center for Professional Mariner Development in Bucksport in February 2020.
- The Center offers online, hybrid and in-person courses to provide certification and professional development training for mariners.

*License majors have a 3rd semester each summer

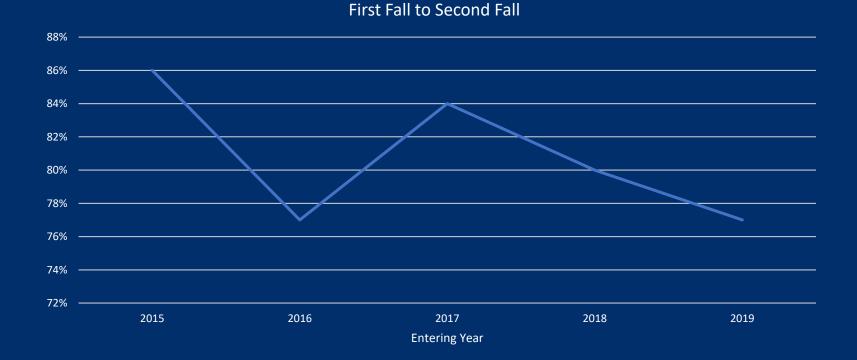
Direct Costs 2021

\$25,253

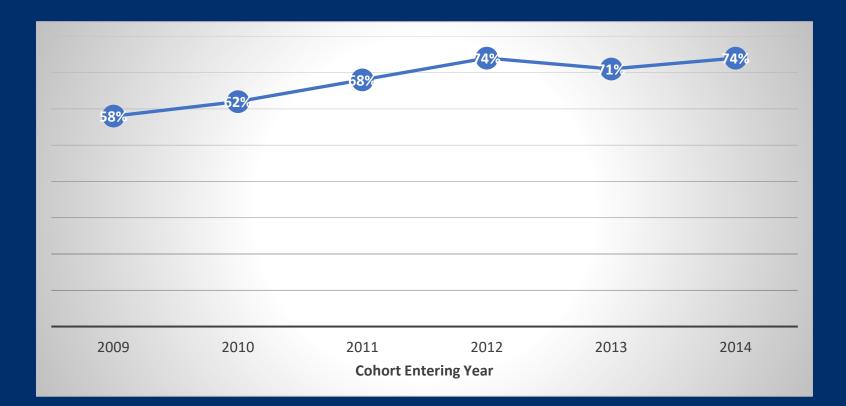
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First Fall to Second Fall Retention

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First Generation Data

- Approximately 40% of the first year class each year is defined as first generation.
- 78% of the Fall 2019 cohort of first generation students persisted to the 2nd year – an 8% increase over the previous year

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Financial Aid

 Percentage of firsttime, full-time students receiving financial aid in 2014 = 91% in 2020 = 96%



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Debt

- Average loan debt increased from \$52,434 for the class of 2016 to \$55,687 for the Class of 2021
- Default rate at MMA as compared to national average of 7.3 % in FY18
