- AEMT to Paramedic experienced Advanced EMTs
 - 10 month program
 - 3 semesters
 - Classroom and Lab Time: 320 hours (288 week day hours, 4 Saturday classes)
 - Hospital and Field Hours: 360 hours (120 Hospital hours, 240 Field hours)
- EMT to Paramedic for EMTs or inexperienced AEMTs
 - 14 month program
 - 4 semesters
 - Classroom and Lab Time: 504 hours (448 week day hours, 7 Saturday classes)
 - Hospital and Field Hours: 504 hours (180 Hospital Hourse, 324 Field hours)
