Representative **ANDREWS**: Mr. Speaker, Ladies and Gentlemen of the House. I rise briefly to speak on this just to put it on the record. I received a phone call from a constituent Sunday and this was a relative of a sexual assault attempted murder victim. Knowing that I had been a victim of violent crime, she asked me to speak on this bill.

I have been unable to get this bill until this morning. This is a 30-page bill. How can I affectively prepare a testimony to support victims of violent crimes when I get the bill the day it is being heard? Thank you.

The SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes the Representative from Bangor, Representative Blanchette.

Representative **BLANCHETTE**: Mr. Speaker, Ladies and Gentlemen of the House. I guess respectfully to reply to the good Representative Andrews that had she desired a report, a copy of this report, it would have been made available to her. The committee will be working this bill today. We are proposing to bring it out of committee on Friday. I do invite the good Representative to come to the public hearing today and to let her input be known. This committee and this commission went overboard in their deliberations and their taking acceptance of statements from members of the public. I agree with the good Representative completely that this is a long and lengthy report that I sat down and took two hours to go through last night from beginning to end.

I do believe that if the good Representative would like to have more time to submit some comments, when we work this bill hopefully on Friday, any and all comments that she wants to give us in regards to this bill will be taken into consideration by the whole committee before we make any recommendations. Thank you.
