'3. <u>Condition of eligibility.</u> An employing unit shall establish a wellness certification program for each participating employee for whom a credit is claimed under this section that requires each participating employee to identify wellness goals and specify health behaviors the employee intends to follow to reach those goals and shall provide regularly scheduled monitoring of wellness goals progress by the wellness program administrator.'

Amend the bill in section 1 in 5219-BB in subsection 4 in the 2nd line (page 1, line 30 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "<u>\$100</u>" and inserting the following: '<u>\$50</u>'

Amend the bill in section 1 in §5219-BB in subsection 4 in the 2nd line (page 1, line 30 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "employee" the following: 'participating in a wellness certification program under subsection 3'

Amend the bill by inserting after section 2 the following:

SUMMARY

This amendment requires employers claiming a wellness credit to establish a wellness certification program that requires each participating employee to identify wellness goals and behaviors and to monitor those goals and reduces the credit per employee from \$100 to \$50.
