Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting the following:

## 'An Act To Extend the Limits on Legislative Terms from 4 to 6 Terms'

Amend the bill by striking out all of sections 1 and 2 and inserting the following:

'Sec. 1. 21-A MRSA §553, sub-§1, as enacted by IB 1993, c. 1, §1 and affected by §2, is amended to read:

1. State Senate. A person may not serve more than <u>4-6</u> consecutive terms as a state Senator.

Sec. 2. 21-A MRSA §553, sub-§2, as enacted by IB 1993, c. 1, §1 and affected by §2, is amended to read:

**2. State Representative.** A person may not serve more than <u>46</u> consecutive terms as a member of the state House of Representatives.

**Sec. 3. Application.** Notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 21-A, section 553, subsections 1 and 2, a person elected to serve a 4th consecutive term as a state Senator in the 123rd Legislature is ineligible to serve as a state Senator in the 124th Legislature, and a person elected to serve a 4th consecutive term as a member of the state House of Representatives in the 123rd Legislature is ineligible to serve as a member of the state House of Representatives in the 124th Legislature.'

Amend the bill in section 3 by striking out all of the question (page 1, line 13 in L.D.) and inserting the following:

"Do you favor extending term limits for Legislators from 4 to 6 terms?"

Amend the amendment by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

## SUMMARY

This amendment differs from the bill, which proposes to repeal term limits, in that it extends term limits for Legislators from 4 to 6 terms. Under the amendment, the extension of allowable terms does not apply to members of the Legislature who are currently serving a 4th consecutive term as a Senator or as a member of the House of Representatives. Like the bill, this amendment submits the proposed alteration in the law governing term limits to the voters for approval.
