All aspects of long-term care must be reviewed, from nursing facility through home-based care and from skilled nursing to homemaker and personal assistant services. By January 15, 2008 the department shall report to the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services the results of the review. The department shall include suggested legislation, rule changes and funding for any improvements to the current system that it recommends and shall price each initiative separately.
