## **Preliminary Fiscal Impact Statement**

State Mandate - Unfunded

Required Activity	<b>Unit Affected</b>	Local Cost
Requires local school administrative units to:	School	Moderate statewide
~ prepare quarterly and annual reports documenting incidents of restraint and		
seclusion to be submitted to superintendents and the Department of Education;		
~ debrief staff and students involved in each incident of physical restraint or seclusion within 2 days of incident;		
~ after debriefing, requires staff to develop and implement a written plan (or review and revise plan if it already exists) for response and de-escalation for the student;		
~ develop a local complaint process to address parent complaints about the use of restraint or seclusion.		

The required local activities in this bill may represent a State mandate pursuant to the Constitution of Maine. Unless General Fund appropriations are provided to fund at least 90% of the additional costs or a Mandate Preamble is amended to the bill and two-thirds of the members of each House vote to exempt this mandate from the funding requirement, municipalities may not be required to implement these changes.

## **Fiscal Detail and Notes**

Additional costs to the Department of Education associated with implementing this rule change can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.
