This amendment directs the Board of Environmental Protection and the Maine Land
Use Regulation Commission to adopt rules governing standing for administrative appeals
to the board and commission, respectively. The standing for administrative appeals must
be the same as the standing that has been established for persons to appeal decisions of
the board or the commission to court. The rules are major substantive rules under the
Maine Administrative Procedure Act and are subject to review by the joint standing
committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over judiciary matters.
