Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry; study plan. 19 Resolved: That the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry shall develop 20 a comprehensive research study plan to identify and aid farmers who are or may be affected 21 by perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances contamination. The department shall 22 develop the study plan in consultation with research partners, including, but not limited to, 23 the University of Maine; the University of Maine Cooperative Extension; the Department of Environmental Protection; and the Department of Health and Human Services, Maine 24 25 Center for Disease Control and Prevention. In developing the study plan, the department may consult with a statewide organization working to protect the public and the 26 environment from toxic chemicals and a statewide organization representing organic 27 28 gardeners and farmers. The study plan must include research topic areas that may include 29 alternative agricultural business planning including energy production and alternative cropping systems, study needs, possible roles of state agencies and research collaborators 30 31 to conduct the work, proposed time frames and a proposed budget and target sources of 32 funding for implementing the plan. The department shall submit a report regarding the 33 comprehensive research study plan, including findings and recommendations, to the Joint 34 Standing Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry by February 1, 2022.' 35 Amend the resolve by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or 36 section number to read consecutively.

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5 6 This amendment changes the title and strikes and replaces the resolve. The amendment directs the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry to develop a comprehensive research study plan to identify and aid farmers who are or may be affected by perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances contamination. The department is required to submit a report regarding the comprehensive research study plan to the Joint Standing Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry by February 1, 2022.

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
