The amendment requires a school administrative unit, a public school within a school administrative unit or a private school, if asking for a student's social security number, to inform the student's parent or legal guardian or the student if the student is 18 years of age or older for what purpose the social security number will be used. The amendment requires the unit or school to provide the parent, legal guardian or student with the opportunity to opt out of providing the social security number.
