## An Act To Amend the Laws Governing Disability Parking Spaces

## 1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §521, sub-§9-A, as amended by PL 2005, c. 528, §1, is
 further amended to read:

9-A. Enforcement of disability parking restrictions. A law enforcement officer 4 may enforce disability parking restrictions. The State Police shall enforce disability 5 parking restrictions at service facilities established on the Maine Turnpike and on the 6 interstate highway system in the State. A person commits a traffic infraction if that 7 person parks in a parking space designated and clearly marked for persons with physical 8 9 disabilities and has not been issued or is not transporting a person who has been issued a 10 disability registration plate or a removable windshield placard pursuant to this section or section 523 or a disability registration plate or placard issued by another state. A person 11 commits a traffic infraction if that person parks in an access aisle, regardless of whether 12 the person has been issued a disability registration plate or removable placard. A parking 13 14 space designated and clearly marked for persons with physical disabilities that is marked as van-accessible with an access aisle may be used only by a van or a vehicle that 15 accommodates a side-loading wheelchair lift or ramp. A person commits a traffic 16 17 infraction if that person parks in a van-accessible parking space and that person's vehicle is not adapted for use of a van-accessible parking space, regardless of whether the person 18 has been issued a disability registration plate or removable placard. Notwithstanding 19 20 section 2604, a person who violates this subsection is subject to a fine of not less than 21 \$200 \$300 and not more than \$500 \$600.

- Sec. 2. 29-A MRSA §521, sub-§9-B, ¶E, as enacted by PL 2005, c. 528, §2, is
  amended to read:
- E. Notwithstanding section 2604, a person who violates this subsection is subject to a fine of not less than \$200 \$300 and not more than \$500 \$600.

Sec. 3. Rules. The Secretary of State shall by rule design a sign to indicate that a parking space is designated for use of van-accessible vehicles for persons with physical disabilities and to distinguish such a sign from other signs for disability parking. The sign designating a space as van-accessible must be outlined in red. Rules adopted pursuant to this section are routine technical rules as defined in the Maine Revised Statute, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.

This bill makes van-accessible handicapped parking spaces with an access aisle that are labeled as van-accessible available only to vans or vehicles adapted for use of a vanaccessible parking space. It also increases the penalty range for violations of parking in access aisles from \$200 to \$500 to \$300 to \$600.
