SUMMARY

This amendment is the minority report of the Joint Standing Committee on 14 15 Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry. The amendment amends the bill to allow the use of pesticides on school grounds in areas where bare ground of 25 square feet or greater 16 exists as the result of pest problems. The amendment also amends the bill by replacing 17 section 2, which directed the Commissioner of Education to adopt rules, with a provision 18 that requires the Commissioner of Education to collaborate with the Department of 19 Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, Board of Pesticides Control in developing school 20 ground construction standards and guidelines and requires a report to the Joint Standing 21 Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs and the Joint Standing Committee on 22 Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry by March 15, 2014. The amendment also adds a 23 mandate preamble and an appropriations and allocations section. 24
