No later than 90 days after the effective date of this legislation, the department shall enter into a

memorandum of understanding with the federally recognized Indian nations, tribes and
bands in the State regarding block grant funds.

**Sec. 2. Report. Resolved:** That, no later than January 31, 2021, the Department of Health and Human Services shall submit a report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over health and human services matters on the status of the memorandum of understanding entered into pursuant to section 1. The committee may report out legislation relating to this report to the First Regular Session of the 130th Legislature.

9 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this 10 legislation takes effect when approved.'

## **SUMMARY**

12 This amendment, which is the minority report of the committee, replaces the bill with 13 a resolve. It directs the Department of Health and Human Services to, no later than 90 days after the effective date of this legislation, enter into a memorandum of understanding 14 with the federally recognized Indian nations, tribes and bands in the State to define and 15 implement meaningful tribal consultation for all block grants received by the State. It 16 also requires the department to report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature 17 having jurisdiction over health and human services matters on the status of the 18 memorandum of understanding no later than January 31, 2021. 19
