The rules must ensure that services are safe and meet quality requirements, license behavioral services by agency and not by service or facility site unless prohibited by federal Department of Justice, Drug Enforcement Administration or other applicable federal requirements and reduce duplication of effort resulting in the least administrative burden on providers as possible. 34 35	This amendment replaces the bill with a resolve. It requires the Department of Health and Human Services to ensure that its rule governing the licensing of mental health

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facilities avoids, as much as possible, standards that require duplicate licensing visits and 1 surveys of behavioral health agencies and allows instead any equivalent standards by either 2 national or state accrediting or licensing bodies. The rules must ensure that services are 3 safe and meet quality requirements, license by agency and not by service or facility site 4 unless prohibited by federal Department of Justice, Drug Enforcement Administration or 5 other applicable federal requirements and reduce duplication of effort on the part of 6 providers as much as possible. The department must submit a report on progress, no later 7 than February 15, 2024, to the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services, 8 and the committee is authorized to report out a bill to the Second Regular Session of the 9 131st Legislature if more legislative action is necessary. 10 11 FISCAL NOTE REQUIRED
