This subsection does not affect any permit that has been granted to a registered primary caregiver prior to the effective date of this subsection.
22 23	This subsection is repealed July 1, 2018. Any ordinances adopted pursuant to this subsection are not authorized and are void after July 1, 2018.

Authority to report out legislation.</b> The Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services is authorized to report out legislation relating to municipal ordinances regarding the location of facilities where registered primary caregivers cultivate marijuana plants within 500 feet of a school to the Second Regular Session of the 128th Legislature.'

30 31 32 33 34	This amendment allows a municipality to adopt an ordinance establishing a moratorium on the location within 500 feet of a preexisting public or private school of new or expanded facilities where registered primary caregivers cultivate marijuana plants. Any ordinance adopted may only be adopted until July 1, 2018. Any ordinance adopted may not affect permits or providers that have been approved prior to the adoption of the

- ordinance. The Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services may report out
- 2 legislation on this topic to the Second Regular Session of the 128th Legislature.
