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SUMMARY

2 This amendment, which is the majority report of the committee, replaces the resolve. It requires the Department of Health and Human Services to submit an application for a 3 waiver from the requirements of federal law and regulations to the United States 4 5 Department of Agriculture. The waiver must seek approval for the Department of Health and Human Services to amend its rules to require a person to show photographic 6 7 identification in order to use an electronic benefits transfer card when it is requested in an establishment that accepts Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program benefits. The 8 Department of Health and Human Services is required to seek the waiver by October 1, 9 2012. The Department of Health and Human Services is also required to continue to 10 develop strategies to combat fraud and abuse in the use of electronic benefits transfer 11 12 cards in the Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program and report its progress in developing new strategies to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having 13 jurisdiction over health and human services matters by December 1, 2012. 14
