1 SUMMARY

The bill provides that personally identifying information that is located within the electronic citation database maintained, administered or contributed to by the Department of Public Safety, Bureau of State Police is confidential. This amendment, which is the majority report of the committee, provides similar protection to information in the bureau's electronic warnings database. It also clarifies that the bill does not prevent a law enforcement officer from sharing this information with another criminal justice agency, serving the Violation Summons and Complaint on the person charged with having committed the traffic infraction or transmitting the electronic Violation Summons and Complaint to the violations bureau of the District Court. Public access to violations bureau court records, including personally identifying information contained in a Violation Summons and Complaint, is governed by the Maine Rules of Civil Procedure, Rule 80F.

The amendment also adds a definition of "personally identifying information."
