An Act To Provide Funding for Costs Associated with Requiring the **Licensing of Midwives**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

- **Sec. 1. Transfer by October 15, 2017.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the State Controller shall transfer \$76,365 from the General Fund unappropriated surplus to the Licensing and Enforcement, Other Special Revenue Funds account within the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation no later than October 15, 2017.
- **Sec. 2. Transfer by July 15, 2018.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the State Controller shall transfer \$26,985 from the General Fund unappropriated surplus to the Licensing and Enforcement, Other Special Revenue Funds account within the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation no later than July 15, 2018.
- **Sec. 3. Transfer by July 15, 2019.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the State Controller shall transfer \$26,985 from the General Fund unappropriated surplus to the Licensing and Enforcement, Other Special Revenue Funds account within the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation no later than July 15, 2019.
- **Sec. 4. Appropriations and allocations.** The following appropriations and allocations are made.

Initiative: Allocates funds for the service center and STA-CAP charges associated with requiring individuals practicing midwifery in the State to be licensed by January 1, 2020.

Licensing and Enforcement 0352
