Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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- 1 **5. Board functions.** The board has the following functions.
- 2 A. The board shall review funding requests and award funds annually for specific 3 programs or activities within the department or for other agencies, nongovernmental 4 organizations or individuals that meet the funding criteria of section 10267, subsection 7 pursuant to a grant proposal, recommendation from the department or 5 6 upon the board's own initiative. Grant proposals must include a stated purpose, a time 7 line, potential outcomes, a budget and an explanation of need. Funding or grant 8 awards that establish a public-private partnership or involve matching funds are 9 encouraged.
- 10 B. The board shall submit an annual report to the Governor and the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over inland fisheries and wildlife 11 12 matters detailing expenditures made from the fund.
 - C. Responsibility for administration of the board lies with the chair appointed under subsection 3. The board shall hire an executive director. The executive director may hire an additional staff person, if the board determines it necessary. The executive director directs the daily operation of the board. A staff position may be part-time. The executive director position is unclassified, and the executive director serves at the pleasure of the board.
 - D. The board shall prepare and adopt an annual budget to be included with the report required under paragraph B. The board may spend money to cover administrative expenses. The board shall endeavor to keep the level of administrative expenses as low as practicable and include, in its annual report, a discussion of efforts to minimize administrative expenses. The department shall provide staff support and assistance as determined necessary by the board.
 - Sec. 3. 12 MRSA §10267 is enacted to read:

§10267. Maine Outdoor Programs and Activities Fund

- 1. **Definitions.** As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.
- "Board" means the Maine Outdoor Programs and Activities Fund Board established in Title 5, section 12004-G, subsection 20-C.
 - B. "Fund" means the Maine Outdoor Programs and Activities Fund.
- 32 2. Fund established. There is established the Maine Outdoor Programs and 33 Activities Fund. The fund consists of revenues received pursuant to section 12501, 34 subsection 8 and any funds received as contributions from private and public sources. 35 The fund, to be accounted within the department, must be held separate and apart from all 36 other money, funds and accounts. Eligible investment earnings credited to the assets of 37 the fund become part of the assets of the fund. Any unexpended balances remaining in 38 the fund at the end of any fiscal year do not lapse and must be carried forward to the next 39
 - fiscal year.

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1	3. Purpose of fund. The fund is for the sole purpose of supporting the mission of
2 3	the department under section 10051 by funding related outdoor programs and activities under subsection 7.
4 5 6 7 8	4. Relation to other funding. The fund supplements sources and levels of funding appropriated and allocated by the Legislature to inland fisheries and wildlife agencies. It is the intent of the Legislature that a grant received from the fund not be considered a substitute for funds previously appropriated or allocated to an inland fisheries and wildlife agency.
9	5. Fund availability. The fund must be available to the department, other agencies,
10	nongovernmental organizations and individuals in accordance with section 10158,
11 12	subsection 5, paragraph A. The department may contract with other agencies, nongovernmental organizations and individuals for the purpose of carrying out programs
13	or activities funded by the fund.
14 15 16	6. Administration. The board shall administer the fund in accordance with section 10158, subsection 5, paragraph D. Administrative expenses may not exceed 10% of the distributions made from the fund under subsection 7.

The board shall fund programs and activities within the department or make grants to other agencies, nongovernmental organizations or individuals, applications for which must be reviewed in accordance with section 10158, subsection 5, paragraph A. The board shall distribute annually on a regional basis available grant money to support inland fisheries and wildlife programs and activities as follows:

Sec. 7. Staggered terms. For the initial members appointed to the Maine Outdoor Program and Activities Fund Board pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 12, section 10158, subsection 2, the Governor shall designate the first appointment for a one-year term, the 2nd appointment for a 2-year term and the 3rd appointment for a 3-year term. A partial term of an initial member under this section does not count toward the 2-term limit of a member under Title 12, section 10158, subsection 2.

7 SUMMARY

 This bill creates the Maine Outdoor Programs and Activities Fund, administered by the Maine Outdoor Programs and Activities Fund Board, to carry out the mission of the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife. The fund provides on a regional basis funding and grants to departmental and other outdoor programs and activities including funding for snowmobile and all-terrain vehicle trail improvements, fish and game organizations and youth outdoor activity programs. The Maine Outdoor Programs and Activities Fund is funded by adding \$1 to a resident fishing license fee and \$2 to a nonresident season fishing license fee for persons 16 years of age or older.
