An Act To Amend the Laws Governing the Address Confidentiality Program

Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §90-B, sub-§1, ¶A, as enacted by PL 2001, c. 539, §1, is
 amended to read:

A. "Address" means a residential street, school or work address of an individual,
 including any geographically specific description or coordinate that identifies a
 residential address, as specified on the individual's application to be a program
 participant under this chapter section.

8 Sec. 2. 5 MRSA §90-B, sub-§7, as enacted by PL 2001, c. 539, §1, is amended to
 9 read:

7. Confidentiality. The program participant's application and, supporting materials
 and the program's state e-mail account are not a public record and must be kept
 confidential by the secretary.

13 SUMMARY
14 This bill makes the following changes to the laws governing the Address
15 Confidentiality Program administered by the Secretary of State.

I. It adds geographically specific descriptions or coordinates that identify a
 residential address to the definition of "address."

18 2. It adds the Address Confidentiality Program's e-mail account to the information19 that must be kept confidential.
