An Act to Support Municipal Public Safety by Increasing State-Municipal Revenue Sharing to 7 Percent

1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 30-A MRSA §5681, sub-§5-D is enacted to read:
3	5-D. Additional transfer to General Fund. In addition to the transfer made pursuant
4	to subsection 5, no later than the 10th day of each month, the State Controller shall transfer
5	to the Local Government Fund 2% of the receipts during the previous month from the taxes
6	imposed under Title 36, Parts 3 and 8, and Title 36, section 2552, subsection 1, paragraphs
7	A to F and L, and credited to the General Fund without any reduction.
8	Sec. 2. 30-A MRSA §5681, sub-§9 is enacted to read:
9	9. Use of revenue sharing funds for emergency services and law enforcement. A
10	municipality that receives revenue sharing funds pursuant to subsection 5-D shall use those
11	funds for emergency fire and medical services and law enforcement purposes, including,
12	without limitation, employment and training of persons providing emergency fire and
13	medical services, such as an emergency medical services person, as defined in Title 32,
14	section 83, subsection 12, a municipal firefighter or volunteer firefighter, as defined in
15	section 3151, subsections 2 and 4, respectively, and a law enforcement officer, as defined
16	in Title 25, section 2801-A, subsection 5, and the provision of services by those persons.
17	SUMMARY
18	This hill in answers the manager of state manipinal necessary sharing from 50/ to 70/
	This bill increases the percentage of state-municipal revenue sharing from 5% to 7%
19	and requires the additional funds to be used by municipalities for the employment, training
20	and provision of emergency fire and medical services and law enforcement.
