## An Act To Revise the Reporting Requirements for Oil Spills

1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2 3	Sec. 1. 38 MRSA §550, sub-§1, as repealed and replaced by PL 1991, c. 66, Pt. A, §18, is amended to read:
4 5 6 7	1. Report and remove. Reports within 2 hours and promptly removes the discharge in accordance with the rules and orders of the board or commissioner. Discharges of less than 5 gallons that occur on land and do not affect any well or drinking water source do not need to be reported; and
8	SUMMARY
9 10 11	Current law requires the discharge of oil into any coastal waters or beaches or any other waters of the State to be reported to the Department of Environmental Protection within 2 hours of the discharge.
12 13 14 15	This bill exempts from that reporting requirement discharges of less than 5 gallons that occur on land and do not affect any well or drinking water source; the person causing or responsible for the discharge is still required to remove the discharge and reimburse
