An Act To Require That Certain Motor Vehicles Be Clear of Snow and Ice When Operated on Public Ways

2	Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §2396, sub-§5 is enacted to read:
3 4 5 6	5. Solid precipitation. A person may not operate a motor vehicle at a speed of 40 miles per hour or more on a public way with a load of solid precipitation on the motor vehicle. For the purposes of this subsection, "solid precipitation" includes, but is not limited to, snow, ice, hail and sleet.
7 8 9	When the load of solid precipitation on a motor vehicle consists of minor amounts, and a reasonable effort has been made to completely remove the load, minor amounts blown from the motor vehicle while in transit do not evidence a violation of this subsection. A violation of this subsection is a traffic infraction subject to a fine of not less than \$250
11 12	for the first offense and not less than \$500 for a 2nd or subsequent offense. This subsection does not apply to commercial trucks.
13	SUMMARY
14 15 16 17	This bill prohibits the operation of a motor vehicle at a speed of 40 miles per hour or more on a public way with a load of solid precipitation on the motor vehicle. Failure to clear a motor vehicle is a traffic infraction subject to a \$250 fine for a first offense and \$500 for a 2nd or subsequent offense. It exempts commercial trucks from the provision.
