An Act To Clarify the Language Defining Schedule W Drugs and To Add Drugs to the List of Schedule W Drugs

1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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Sec. 1. 17-A MRSA §1102, sub-§1, ¶I, as amended by PL 2015, c. 492, §1, is
 further amended to read:

4 I. Unless listed or described in another schedule, any compound, mixture or 5 preparation containing narcotic drugs in any quantity, including, but not limited to, the following narcotic drugs or their salts, isomers or salts of isomers: heroin 6 (diacetylmorphine), methadone, methadone hydrochloride, levo-alpha-acetyl-7 8 methadol, or LAAM, pethidine, phenylpiperazine, mitragynine, U-47700, morphine, oxycodone, hydrocodone, hydromorphone, buprenorphine, fentanyl, despropionyl 9 fentanyl, furanylfentanyl, fluorofentanyl, acetylfentanyl and any methylfentanyl 10 11 derivatives and opium;

SUMMARY

This bill clarifies that any compound, mixture or preparation containing narcotic
drugs in any quantity is a schedule W drug unless listed or described in another schedule.
The bill adds phenylpiperazine, mitragynine, U-47700, despropionyl fentanyl,
furanylfentanyl and fluorofentanyl to the list of schedule W drugs.
