The one-time monitoring of aerial applications required under this section is contingent upon the receipt of outside funds for this purpose. The board shall report to the Joint Standing Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry with findings and recommendations related to the monitoring of aerial applications of herbicides must conclude upon submission of the report to the joint standing committee. The joint standing committee may submit a bill relating to the subject matter of the report to the Second Regular Session of the 129th Legislature.'

31	This amendment, which is the majority report of the committee, strikes the bill and

replaces it with a resolve. The amendment requires the Board of Pesticides Control within the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry to work with representatives of the forest products industry over the next several months to monitor

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- aerial applications of herbicides through a neutral 3rd-party entity determined by the
 board and at the cost of the forest products industry.
- 3 The amendment requires the board to report to the Joint Standing Committee on 4 Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry by February 1, 2020.
