The trust shall ensure that measures to reduce the cost of residential heating are available for low-income households as defined by the trust. When promoting electricity cost and consumption reduction, the trust may consider measures at commercial and industrial facilities that also lower peak capacity demand. Subject to the apportionment pursuant to this subsection, the trust shall fund conservation programs that give priority to measures with the highest benefit-to-cost ratio, as long as cost-effective collateral efficiency opportunities are not lost, and that:

- (1) Reliably reduce greenhouse gas production and heating energy costs by fossil fuel combustion in the State at the lowest cost in funds from the trust fund per unit of emissions; or
- (2) Reliably increase the efficiency with which energy in the State is consumed at the lowest cost in funds from the trust fund per unit of energy saved.
- B. Expenditures from the trust fund relating to conservation of electricity and mitigation or reduction of greenhouse gases must be made predominantly on the basis of a competitive bid process for long-term contracts, subject to rules adopted by the board under section 10105. Rules adopted by the board to implement the competitive bid process under this paragraph may not include an avoided cost methodology for compensating successful bidders. Bidders may propose contracts designed to produce greenhouse gas savings or electricity conservation savings, or both, on a unit cost basis. Contracts must be commercially reasonable and may require liquidated damages to ensure performance. Contracts must provide sufficient certainty of payment to enable commercial financing of the conservation measure purchased and its installation.
- C. The board may target bid competitions in areas or to participants as they consider necessary, as long as the requirements of paragraph A are satisfied.
- D. Community-based renewable energy projects, as defined in section 3602, subsection 1, may apply for funding from the trust to the extent they are eligible under paragraph A.
- E. The size of a project funded by the trust fund is not limited as long as funds are awarded to maximize energy efficiency and support greenhouse gas reductions and to fully implement the triennial plan.
- F. No more than \$800,000 of trust fund receipts in any one year may be used for the costs of administering the trust fund pursuant to this section. The limit on administrative costs established in this paragraph does not apply to the following costs that may be funded by the trust fund:

It reduces from \$7,500,000 to \$4,000,000 the allocation to the Department of 25 Education in fiscal year 2021-22 to fund competitive grants for higher education institutions and adult education programs; 26 27 8. It removes the requirement that the Maine State Housing Authority enter into project 28

labor agreements requiring the use of workers who have participated in collective bargaining and that the authority require persons awarded contracts for affordable housing projects to demonstrate a good faith effort to promote workforce diversity;

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- 9. It removes the requirement that the Efficiency Maine Trust provide initiatives to develop and support climate change mitigation strategies to reduce greenhouse gas emissions at industrial facilities in the State;
- 10. It reduces from \$40,000,000 to \$35,000,000 in fiscal year 2022-23 the allocation to the Maine State Housing Authority to expand affordable housing options;
- 11. It removes the requirement that the newly created Maine Connectivity Authority collaborate with organizations representing marginalized and historically disadvantaged groups when making determinations for the distribution of funds for affordable high-speed broadband;
- 12. It removes the contingent allocation of \$10,000,000 to the Department of Transportation, Multimodal Transportation Fund for the construction of a confined aquatic

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disposal cell in the Port of Portland and dredging of the marine facilities of Portland and South Portland;

- 13. It removes all of Part AA, which reinstates the State's property tax deferral program for the elderly and disabled;
- 14. It removes the requirement that landlords test private wells for arsenic every 5 years as well as the requirement that the Department of Health and Human Services amend its rules regarding drinking water to revise the maximum contaminant level for arsenic;
- 15. It removes Part CC, which directs the Department of Health and Human Services to establish the Family Caregiver Grant Pilot Program;
- 16. It allocates \$5,500,000 in fiscal year 2021-22 to the Department of Environmental Protection for the installation of a high-efficiency biomass combined heat and power system at the Duvaltex facility in Guilford;
- 17. It removes the allocation of \$4,000,000 to the Maine Commission on Indigent Legal Services to aid in reducing the backlog of cases;
- 18. It removes the allocation of \$500,000 in fiscal years 2021-22 and 2022-23 to the Permanent Commission on the Status of Racial, Indigenous and Maine Tribal Populations to support the development of investments in public health infrastructure to reduce racial disparities in outcomes in minority groups;
 - 19. It removes Part HH, which establishes a Housing Navigation Pilot Program;
- 20. It removes Part II, which requires the Commissioner of Economic and Community Development to establish a pilot project for outreach to active military members transitioning to civilian life to encourage them to relocate to Maine;
- 21. It removes Part JJ, which establishes a public service campaign to promote direct care worker jobs;
- It removes Part KK, which requires the Commissioner of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry to work with the Department of Economic and Community Development and other relevant state agencies, industry stakeholders and community organizations to: strengthen the State's agricultural, food and forest products economy with a priority of making resulting efforts more inclusive of and increasing investments in historically marginalized, underrepresented and underserved communities; improve investment in agricultural, food and forest products industries to increase access to new markets in ways that balance the desire for short-term returns on investment with the State's commitment to redress racial and other inequities; establish the Maine Agriculture, Food and Forest Products Investment Fund to facilitate strategic investments in the State's agricultural, food and forest products processing and manufacturing industries, including value-added products; and establish the Maine Agriculture, Food System and Forest Products Infrastructure Investment Advisory Board, representing a diversity of skills and experience relevant to investment in agricultural, food and forest products industries and the racial diversity of the food system in the State with specific representation by Indian tribes, communities of color and other underserved communities and populations, to determine disbursements from and oversee the Maine Agriculture, Food and Forest Products Investment Fund, to devise a process for requests for proposals and enter into 3rdparty contracts to carry out the purposes of the fund and related technical assistance

programs and to provide regular reporting and evaluation related to performance and sustainability; and

23. Part NN repeals provisions concerning the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative Trust Fund in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 35-A, section 10109 regarding the transfer of funds from that fund to the Public Utilities Commission for disbursement to affected customers to support efficiency measures. It directs the Efficiency Maine Trust to establish an industrial climate transition initiative to develop and support climate change mitigation strategies designed to reduce greenhouse gas emissions at industrial facilities in the State. It provides an allocation of \$6,000,000 in fiscal year 2021-22 to the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative Trust Fund within the Efficiency Maine Trust to fund the establishment and activities of that industrial climate transition initiative.
