An Act To Slow the Rate at Which the State's Minimum Wage Increases and To Eliminate Cost-of-living Increases to the Minimum Wage

1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

2 Sec. 1. 26 MRSA §664, sub-§1, as amended by IB 2015, c. 2, §1, is further 3 amended to read:

4 **1. Minimum wage.** The minimum hourly wage is \$7.50 per hour. Starting January 1, 2017, the minimum hourly wage is \$9.00 per hour; starting January 1, 2018, the 5 minimum hourly wage is \$10.00 per hour; starting. Starting January 1, 2019 2020, the 6 minimum hourly wage is \$11.00 \$10.50 per hour; and starting January 1, 2020 2021, the 7 8 minimum hourly wage is \$12.00 \$11.00 per hour; starting January 1, 2022, the minimum hourly wage is \$11.50 per hour; and starting January 1, 2023, the minimum hourly wage 9 10 is \$12.00 per hour. On January 1, 2021 and each January 1st thereafter, the minimum 11 hourly wage then in effect must be increased by the increase, if any, in the cost of living. The increase in the cost of living must be measured by the percentage increase, if any, as 12 13 of August of the previous year over the level as of August of the year preceding that year 14 in the Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers, CPI-W, for 15 the Northeast Region, or its successor index, as published by the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics or its successor agency, with the amount 16 of the minimum wage increase rounded to the nearest multiple of 5¢. If the highest 17 18 federal minimum wage is increased in excess of the minimum wage in effect under this 19 section, the minimum wage under this section is increased to the same amount, effective 20 on the same date as the increase in the federal minimum wage, and must be increased in 21 accordance with this section thereafter.

SUMMARY

This bill:

22

Slows the rate at which the State's minimum wage increases by starting with
\$10.50 per hour on January 1, 2020 and increasing it by 50¢ per hour each year until it
reaches \$12.00 per hour on January 1, 2023; and

272. Eliminates the requirement that the minimum wage increase each year by the28 percentage increase in the cost of living.
