As funds are available, the Maine Apprenticeship Program, through the department, shall make available grants to support preapprenticeship training programs under this section. A preapprenticeship training program shall use the grants to provide meaningful support and stipends to facilitate enrollment and participation in the program. Support may include funding for child care, transportation, training materials, tools, personal protective equipment and reimbursement of other expenses that may be incurred by a student an individual to facilitate the student's individual's attendance and participation in the program and funding to facilitate an individual's readiness to commence on-the-job learning in a registered apprenticeship program. Stipends may include cash payments. In allocating grants among preapprenticeship training programs, the Maine Apprenticeship Program shall give priority to programs that have demonstrated successful engagement and enrollment of students and completion by individuals from historically marginalized communities in preapprenticeship training programs and successful placement and enrollment of and completion by individuals from historically marginalized communities in registered apprenticeship programs.

31 32 33	1. Administration; directed to certain training programs. Funding provided by this Act for grants to support preapprenticeship training programs is subject to the provisions of the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 26, section 3213, subsection 6 and must:			
34 35	A. Be administered and awarded to preapprenticeship training programs with strong direct entry links with registered apprenticeship programs through a competitive			

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- process administered by the Department of Labor through the Maine Apprenticeship

- B. Be directed to preapprenticeship training programs that train individuals for priority
 sectors for high-wage, in-demand jobs.
- 2. Majority of funding for certain training programs. At least 51% of the funding

It retains the current law allowing for certification of these programs. It specifies that at least 51% of the funds provided for grants to support preapprenticeship training programs must support training programs that have consistently placed individuals in registered apprenticeship programs that lead to jobs that pay no less than \$35 per hour.
