## §12054. Field trials; raccoon and rabbits

- 1. Raccoon dog field trials. A person may hold raccoon dog field trials at any time. [PL 2003, c. 414, Pt. A, §2 (NEW); PL 2003, c. 614, §9 (AFF).]
- 2. (TEXT EFFECTIVE UNTIL 1/01/24) Rabbit hound field trials. A person may not hold field trials for beagles and other rabbit hounds except from September 1st through the following April 10th. A person who violates this subsection commits a Class E crime. [PL 2003, c. 414, Pt. A, §2 (NEW); PL 2003, c. 614, §9 (AFF).]
- 2. (TEXT EFFECTIVE 1/01/24) Rabbit hound field trials. A person may not hold field trials for beagles and other rabbit hounds except from September 1st through the following April 10th. A person who violates this subsection commits a civil violation.

**3. Sporting dog field trials.** The licensing and conduct of sporting dog field trials is governed by section 12055.
