Senator JOHNSON: Thank you, Mr. President. I am deeply concerned that this matter actually is before us at this point in light of the fact that this rule, this rule making, has not, since it was first presented to us with the same language and was dealt with by a previous Legislature, has not since then been properly given an opportunity for the public to weigh in with the department and has not followed the Administrative Procedures Act accordingly. This is, I think, something which we should not be. at this time, considering, given that. I have spoken with the Attorney General's Office, the Attorney General, who indicated that, in its present form, the rule making would not be signed off on because of that failing, not having followed the Administrative Procedures Act. Even if the language is the same as the previous time, it needs to follow due process, as a rule, and I would suggest that we not accept this report. Instead we should be moving Indefinite Postponement of this bill and all its accompanying papers.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Franklin, Senator Saviello.

Senator SAVIELLO: Thank you, Mr. President. Ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, I appreciate the concern expressed by the good Senator because I have a policy in my committee, and work hard at it, to make sure that the public is fully informed. I, too, just talked to the Attorney General. Let me say, our interpretation of the conversation is a little bit different. I'm not going to get into that detail. I will tell you that last week, having this concern, I asked that I meet, along with my committee cochair, Representative Welch, from the other Body, to talk about these rules. I decided not to attend that meeting. Instead I appointed, in a bipartisan fashion, Representative John Martin to take my place. You see, he probably not only knows these laws and rules better than anybody, he probably wrote them. After that meeting he came in and advised me that we can move forward. The other day the other Body passed, based on that advice, the unanimous references in this bill to the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources. It's time to move forward. It's time to move them to that committee so that we can do the appropriate work. Thank you very much, Mr. President.
