1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §2353, sub-§4**, as amended by PL 2023, c. 71, §1 and c. 161, §3,
3 is further amended to read:

4 **4. Community-based drug overdose prevention programs; standing orders for**
5 **naloxone hydrochloride or another opioid overdose-reversing medication.** Acting
6 under standing orders from a licensed health care professional authorized by law to
7 prescribe naloxone hydrochloride or another opioid overdose-reversing medication, a
8 ~~public health~~ an agency that provides services to populations at high risk for a drug
9 overdose may establish an overdose prevention program in accordance with rules adopted
10 by the department and the provisions of this subsection.

11 A. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, an overdose prevention
12 program established under this subsection may store and dispense naloxone
13 hydrochloride or another opioid overdose-reversing medication without being subject
14 to the provisions of Title 32, chapter 117 as long as these activities are undertaken
15 without charge or compensation.

16 B. An overdose prevention program established under this subsection may distribute
17 unit-of-use packages of naloxone hydrochloride or another opioid overdose-reversing
18 medication and the medical supplies necessary to administer the naloxone
19 hydrochloride or another opioid overdose-reversing medication to a person ~~who has~~
20 ~~successfully completed training provided by the overdose prevention program that~~
21 ~~meets the protocols and criteria established by the department~~, so that the person may
22 possess and administer naloxone hydrochloride or another opioid overdose-reversing
23 medication to an individual who appears to be experiencing an opioid-related drug
24 overdose.

25 C. With the express consent of a municipality, an overdose prevention program
26 established under this subsection may provide and maintain naloxone hydrochloride or
27 another opioid overdose-reversing medication in a wall-mounted box or other visible
28 and accessible container, including, but not limited to, a vending machine, on publicly
29 accessible property of the municipality, including a municipal building, public
30 restroom, public library or public park or recreational facility, for use by a member of
31 the public in response to an opioid-related drug overdose.

32 The department shall adopt rules to implement this subsection. Rules adopted pursuant to
33 this subsection are routine technical rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter
34 2-A.
